YANKOVICH-MILLER HILL ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND MULTI-USE PATH PROJECT NO. NFHWY00139/0002(378) UPDATES

Yankovich Road and Miller Hill Road serve vehicular and pedestrian traffic between Sheep Creek Road and Ballaine Road. Yankovich Road is a 1.67-mile east-west corridor with residences and some public points of interest such as the Large Animal Research Station (LARS). Miller Hill Road is a 0.71-mile northsouth roadway that connects Sheep Creek Road on the south and Yankovich Road on the north with a separated bike path along the east side. The two roads are similar in character with narrow 10-foot lanes for vehicular traffic and 0- to 2-foot shoulders for other users. To improve safety for pedestrian, bicycle and vehicle traffic on Yankovich Road and Miller Hill Road, the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT&PF) proposes to:



- Upgrade/widen Yankovich Road to 32 feet (10-foot lanes and 6-foot shoulders);
- Reconstruct Miller Hill Road by widening the existing roadway surface toward the separated path to 30 feet (10-foot lanes and 5-foot shoulders);
- Pave the remaining portion of the Miller Hill Road separated path;
- Improve sight distance and road geometry at roadway and driveway intersections;
- Improve drainage; and
- Raise or lower Yankovich Road to eliminate blind spots.

The project schedule is outlined below.
